Tom Bruntz is doing better, he is getting hospice help and is on oxygen 24-7 now and they plan on attending the meeting this month.

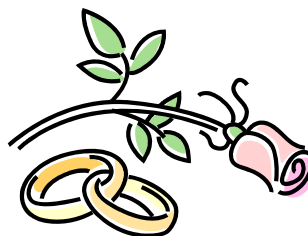
Harold Pollard is back home now in Barbara's care, he is getting around slowly and they hope to make it to the Christmas meeting
